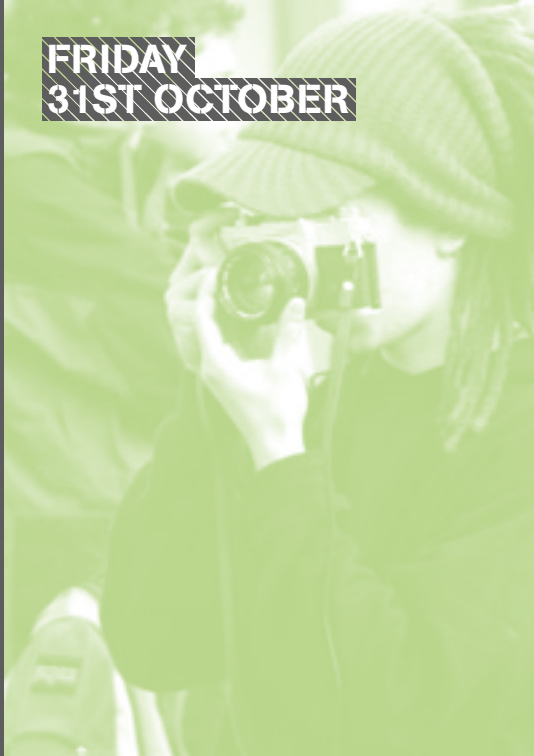

In the Pavilion galleries:
