Unpopular Culture: Curated by Grayson Perry Kate Adams: The Not Knowing of Another

10 May – 6 July 2008

Eccentric Turner Prize-winning potter Grayson Perry will present a personal selection of photography, sculpture and painting from the 1940s - 1970s, selected from the Arts Council Collection, alongside two new pieces of his own work, depicting 'Englishness'. Hastings based artist Kate Adams presents new mixed media work exploring our sense of perception.

Nathan Coley

26 July – 21 September 2008

Nominated for the 2007 Turner Prize, Nathan Coley's work is based around an interest in public space, and addresses issues such as the importance of place, the social value of architecture and the meaning and relevance of contemporary monuments.

Ben Nicholson

11 October 2008 – 4 January 2009

Ben Nicholson (1894-1982) was one of the most radical British artists of the twentieth century. This will be the first major presentation of his work in the UK for over fourteen years. The exhibition reconsiders his position in British art history offering a new understanding of the modern in art.

Architecture and Modernism

The unique environment of the De La Warr Pavilion is the perfect stimulus for an exploration of architecture and design, and of Modernism in particular.

Our DLWP Resource Pack, developed in collaboration with teachers, is free to schools and has activities appropriate for both primary and secondary/FE level. Rather than presenting a series of facts, it outlines a way of 'reading' buildings and above all, it encourages students to use their own experiences of living in the built environment.
