Ben Nicholson

11 October 2008 – 4 January 2009

Ben Nicholson was one of the most radical British artists of the twentieth century, whose work came to be seen as the quintessence of British modernism. This will be the first major presentation of his work in the UK for over fourteen years. The exhibition reconsiders his position in British art history offering a new understanding of the modern in art.



Iraq & Afghanistan: The Sublime Image of Destruction Brighton Photo Biennial 2008

4 October 2008 – 4 January 2009

As part of the Biennial theme – Images of Fire: the war of images and images of war – this exhibition explores the depiction of war by art photographers. Following the armies, in the wake of the destructive forces, they document the aftermath of destruction. Exhibiting artists include Simon Norfolk, Luc Delahaye and Paul Seawright. Michael Nyman

January – April 2009

The first major exhibition of Michael Nyman's video work from the past 15 years. Celebrated composer Michael Nyman is among experimental music's most high-profile proponents, best known for his film scores for director Peter Greenaway and *The Piano* by Jane Campion. The exhibition will have an associated music and live events programme.

Susan Collins

April – June 2009

Susan Collins's work draws upon classical landscape traditions in painting to create digital works which unfold in real time. The Pavilion has co-commissioned a new project focusing on the South Coast, from Margate to Chichester, that will generate a series of gradually unfolding, beautiful digital seascapes created by images harvested from webcams overlooking the sea.

Young Curators Programme

April – June 2009

Alongside Susan Collins, we will present our second exhibition conceived, developed and realised by a group of local young people, featuring new work commissioned from students across Rother.

Joseph Beuys

June – September 2009

Beuys is considered one of the most influential figures in modern and contemporary art. Artist, political and social activist, teacher and showman, he gained international fame in the 1960s but his innovative influence is still felt today.

This exhibition is possible as a result of the recent Anthony d'Offay bequest to Tate and the National Galleries of Scotland.
