Young Curators: Things Fall Apart

4 April – 15 June

British artist Susan Collins's work draws upon classical landscape traditions in painting to create digital works which develop in real time. This project generates a series of gradually unfolding, beautiful digital seascapes created by images captured from webcams overlooking the sea, sited at different locations along the south east coast of England.



Our Young Curators, a group of young people aged 16-21, take over Gallery 2 with an exhibition of new work commissioned by the group from local young artists. The theme of **Things Fall Apart** reflects ideas of disintegration, fragmentation and catastrophe. This innovating programme enables students to engage with the creative process of their peers in a professional setting.

JOSEPH BEUYS

4 July – 27 September

The De La Warr Pavilion is one of a number of galleries across the UK involved in the ARTISTS ROOM Exhibitions in 2009. We are presenting the work of Joseph Beuys, one of the 20th Century's most influential artists. The collection on Beuys is a remarkable holding of work that brings together sculptures photographs, drawings, watercolours as well as hundreds of posters recalling actions and events by Beuys. We intend to display a large part of this with a particular focus on his relics and actions exploring economics, politics, activism, anti-establishment, teaching and learning, philosophical influences and how these ideas have extended beyond his own lifetime. We are especially interested in exploring with audiences today the expanded concept of art as understood by Beuys; the democratic potential of creativity.
